Q. Do you know, or have you reason to believe, that the Imperial Japanese Forces failed to treat prisoners of war with humanity
or otherwise committed atrocities and war crimes against them?

A. Yes.

- Q. Will you state all facts in detail pert ling to atrocities, war crimes, violations of Rules of Land Warfare and human decency at Balanga Pampanga, the dates thereof, the perpetrators, giv—

 (camp or other place)
 ing their names, ranks, units and other identifying information.
- A. Early part of 1943 I saw a squad of 10 Filipinos beheaded at Balanga-Pampanga. We were working on Bataan cleaning the peninsula. There had been a lot of stealing from the Japs. They caught three Filipinos stealing a tire of a vehicle. One of them who said he was a Lt. in Philippine Scouts was tortured in many ways. He didn't talk at all. He was beaten, burned, given water cure, sun cure and finally he died the next morning. Another man caught a young Filipino of 15 or 16 who talked as soon as they applied torture. He named 7 other men. They were rounded up and moved out, Filar-Bagac road and executed by having head chopped off by SASAKIE, a Japanese Lt., 5'8" tall, slender, wore heavy glasses, 30 to 35 yrs. old, dark complexion, walked and talked like a fairy. Spoke good English, believed he lived in Yokohama.

Capt. NOEL, USA Medical Corps, and 30 other men of our detail witnessed this execution.

That's all I know about this incident.
