Among recent gifts to the Harrodsburg Historical Society is a quaint old tin tallow candle lantern given by Mrs. Margaret Carr Lester, and a flax hackle from Phillip Carr. In early days a great deal of flax and hemp was raised by the pioneer families of the state.

Mr. Frederic F. McClellan, wife and son, of Muncie, Ind., visited the Fort on Friday. Mr. McClellan's mother and father were married by the father of Mrs. Edmund Ball, the Rev. Crosley, a Universalist minister. Mrs. Ball gave the pretty brick chapel which covers and protects the Lincoln marriage cabin in the park.

FEDERAL JAIL FOR KENTUCKY

Prison Director Sanford Bates Wednesday told the House appropriations committee at Washington the new Federal jail, planned for Kentucky, should be located in the eastern part of the state because the commitment of prisoners in that area is one of the largest in the nation.

Mr. Bates told the committee that 86 of the 124 prisons inspected by the U. S. Bureau of Prisons were found to be unfit to hold Federal prisoners.

\$1,000,000 IS FLOOD DAMAGE IN STATE

Unaffected by the light rains in the upper valley of the Ohio river, the crest continued to fall this week. A two foot drop with the next 24 hours was seen April 1. Meanwhile scores of persons are being inoculated against typhoid fever. Damage in the area of Kentucky's largest city is estimated to be near a million dollars.
