The plaintiffs Homer Houchins and J.C.Royalty state that the defendant Henry Isam is indebted to them in the sum of \$64.65 with six per cent per annum thereon from April, 14th, 1921, till paid, evidenced by his certain promissory note for the sum of \$64,65, which the defendant executed and delivered to the plaintiffs and by the terms of which he promised and agreed to pay plaintiffs the said sum of \$64.65, in six months after date of April, 14th, 1921 and bearing six per cent per annum interest from date; they say that said note is just due and unpaid and that no part of same has ever been paid; they say that the plaintiff has no property in this State subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the demand of plaintiffs and claims of the defendants creditors, and that the collection of their claim will be endangerd by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore plaintiffs pray judgment against the defendant Henry Isham for the sum of \$64,65 with interest thereon from the 14th, day of April 1921 till paid, for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for their costs and all proper relief.
