

WILL of J. Hamilton Browning.

I, J. Hamilton Browning, of sound mind and memory, though physically weak, do make this my last will and testament, hereby expressly revoking all former wills made by me.

Item 1st. I desire that **any** debts **that** I may leave shall be paid as promptly as may be.

Item 2nd. I give to my daughter, Dorothy Browning, all policies of insurance, whether accident or life, taken out by me, except such as may be payable to my wife, who, of course is entitled to any policies made payable to her.

Item 3rd. I give to my wife, Roberta C. Browning, for and during her life, or until she marry again, the income from the residue of my property, and at the death of my said wife, or upon her marrying again, which ever first occurs, I give such income to my said daughter until she arrives at the age of twenty-one years, and upon her arrival at the age of twenty-one years I give said residue in fee to my said daughter.

Item 4th. In the event of the death of my said daughter before becoming twenty-one years of age, then said residue, as well as what may remain from the proceeds of said policies of insurance, shall pass and go to my next of kin, under the present laws of descent and distribution of the State of Virginia.

Item 5th. I appoint my beloved wife, Roberta C. Browning, Executrix of this my last will and testament and guardian for my said daughter Dorothy, and I give to my said Executrix power to sell and convey any and all of the real estate of which I may die seized and possessed.
