The plaintiff, Harrodsburg Implement Company, states that it is a corporation, incorporated under the laws of the State of Kentucky, and having <sup>its</sup> ~~the~~ principal place of business at Harrodsburg, Ky; that it is empowered to do a general mercantile business in all kind of farming implements and utensils; to buy and sell; ~~and to contract and be contracted with, and to sue and be sued in its corporate name.~~ to contract and be contracted with, and to sue and be sued in its corporate name.

The plaintiff states that on March 11, 1920, the defendants, Mart Hammonds, Lillard Hammonds and W, P, Harvey, signed, executed and delivered to the plaintiff their joint promissory note whereby they agreed and bound themselves to pay to the plaintiff on or before the 31st day of December, 1920, the sum of Ninety Five dollars with 6% interest thereon from date until paid; that said note, a true copy of which is filed herewith as part hereof, is long past due and that no part thereof has been paid.

Plaintiff states that its debt arises upon contract, as above set out; that it should recover thereon the sum of Ninety Five dollars with 6% interest thereon from March 11, 1920, until paid and its costs herein expended; that defendants have no property in this State subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiffs demand and that said ~~demands~~ <sup>demand</sup> will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.
