Plaintiffs, Hunter Coleman & W. B. Goddard state that defendant Nelson Clay is indebted to them in the sum of \$59.00 for professional services rendered him at his special instance and request; that said account is just, due and unpaid; and though demand has been made upon defendant he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account or any part of same.

Plaintiffs say that this is an action upon a contract, being a contract to pay money for professional services rendered; that they believe they ought to recover the amount of the account, to wit; \$59.00; that said account is just, that defendant has no property in this state subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness, and collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray judgment against defendant for the sum of \$59.00, for cost of this action, and for a general order of attachment of property of defendant, including a summons against James W. Green, proprietor of Green's Barber Shop, and for all other relief to which they may appear
