The Plaintiff, T.C.Scott, states that the Defendant, Ira Duncan,

is indebted to him in the sum of Seventy-one Dollars and Eighty-four cents (\$71.84) for goods and merchandise sold and delivered by him to the Defendant, at his special instance and request, in July and August, 1919, and account for which marked "A", showing the items sold and delivered and the charges therefor, is filed herewith as part hereof, no part of which has been paid. Plaintiff says that the charges made for said merchandise are just and reasonable and which the Defendant agreed to pay when due. He says that all of said account is past due. Wherefore Plaintiff prays judgment against the Defendant for the sum of \$71.84 and interest thereon from September 1, 1919, until paid and his cost herein expended. He prays for all proper relief.
