Plaintiffs, D. H. Coleman & W. B. God-

dard state that defendant Louis Young is indebted to them in the sum of \$24.00 on account; same being for professional services rendered said Louis Young at his special instance and request; they state that said account is just, due and unpaid, and though demand has been made upon defendant he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account or any part of same.

Plaintiffs state that this is an action upon a contract, being a contract to pay money for professional services rendered; that said account is just, that they believe they ought to recover the full amount of the account to wit, \$24.00; that defendant has no property in the state subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said indebtedness and that collection will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray judgment against defendant for the sum of \$24.00, for the cost of this

action, and for a general order of attachment against defendants property or so much thereof as will satisfy and pay said indebted-
