Plaintiff, J. H. Rucker, states that defendant, W. R. Burns, is indebted to him in the sum of \$54.59 on open account; that said account is just, due and unpaid, and though demand has been made upon defendant, he has failed and refused and still fails and refuses to pay said account or any part of same. Wherefore, etc.

Plaintiff says that this is an action on a contract, being a contract to pay money for groceries and supplies and etc, furnished him at his special instance and request; that said account is just; that he ought to recover the sum of \$54.59, the amount of account sued on; that defendant has no property in this state, or not enough thereof to satisfy and pay said demand, and that collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and return of no property found.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against defendant for the sum of \$54.59; for cost of this action and for a general order of attachment against defendant's property, including a summons against the Henry Clay Fire Insurance Company, as
