The plaintiff, C.A.Vandivier, states that the defendants W.E.Haines and Belle Haines are indebted to him in the sum of \$42.00, for balance due on account for work done by him in plowing and cultivating a certain garden owned by the said defendants.

He states that the said Defendants agreed and promised to pay him the above sum, but that they have failed and refuse to do so.

He states that the nature of the claim is as above set out; that it is just, due and owing and that he ought to recover of the defendant the above sum and costs of this action.

He states for the recovery of money and that the defendants are about to sell, convey and otherwise dispose of their property for the purpose of cheating, hindering and delating their creditors, including this plaintiff, and unless prevented by attachment they will sell same.

Wherefore he prays for a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, for a judgment against them in the sum of \$42.00, for his costs and all proper relief.
