

Lt. VanArsdall Died In Ship Sinking

HARRODSBURG, Ky., July 26 (Special)—The 17th officially announced death among the 66 men of Mercer county taken prisoners of the Japanese at the fall of Batan, April 9, 1942, was recorded this week.

VanArsdall of Harrodsburg, lost
his life when a Japanese transport VanArsdaii of Harrodsburg, lost his life when a Japanese transport kearrying prisoners of war was sunk in the China Sea, Dec. 15, 1944, according to a message yesterday from the War Department to his wife, Mrs. Esther McNamer Van-Arsdall, who now is residing with her parents in Somerset. Lieutenant VanArsdall had been a member for several years of the Harrodsburg National Guard tank unit, before it was merged with the 192nd Tank Battalion at Fort Knox, and sent to the Philippine Islands in November, 1941. He was one of Harrodsburg's 66 men taken prisoners at the fall of Batan.
