C.O.Vandivier Plff vs W. E. Hain &c Deft

Affiant, Bell Hain comes and asks the Court to be made a party defendant in each of the foregoing actions, and states that she is the wife of the defendant W. E. Hain, and was his wife at and before the time of issual of the attachment herein, and that she and her husband resided in Mercer County, Ky, as husband and wife up until about June 1, 1914. and at said time her husband abandoned her and left the state of Kentucky and she does not now know his residence; she states that ~~thaxixaxixaxixaxixaxixaxix~~ ~~axixaxixaxixaxixaxix~~ she and the defendant W. E. Hain have one child about 3 months of age; that at the time of the abandonment by her husband he gave her \$10 which is the only property he left her beside a garden of vegeatables consisting of about ten acres, which on account of lack of cultivation is now almost worthless except as to a patch of potatoes growing therein; she states the defendant W. E. Hain has no other property in this state or out of it so far as she knows ~~ix~~ except a few articles of household furniture hardly sufficient for the use of herself and baby and the whole thereof is not worth exceeding \$50.00; she states that she is wholly dependent upon the few vegetables now growing in the garden for a living and has no property of her own.. Wherefore she claims said property as exempt from attachment under the laws of Kentucky, and prays that she may be permitted to defend these actions in the absence of her husband. She prays that all of said property be set aside to her as exempt from the attachments levied in these cases,, she prays for all proper relief and her costs.
