The persons under consideration were in or serving with the armed services of the United States at the time of their capture by the Japanese forces.

b. OQMG Forms 371 are not available for those persons whose names are preceded by an asterisk, but the records indicate they did not survive and return to military control.

- c. The personnel under consideration are believed to have been lost while being transported on several ships operated by the Japanese forces between the Philippines and Japan. Area search and recovery operations have been completed in the island areas between the Philippines and Japan and in the Japan area. Identification operations have been completed for remains recovered at Formosa, and the remains of none of the persons listed have been identified individually. It is not possible to associate definitely any of the persons listed with any of the Unknowns recovered in Formosa or in Japan.
- 3. It is recommended that the remains of the deceased personnel listed on attached sheets be considered non-recoverable, and that all records pertaining to search and recovery of remains be closed.




