The Plaintiff, Woolson Spice Company, states that it is a corporation created and organized under the laws of the State of Ohio, ~~with~~ <sup>principal</sup> office and place of business is at Toledo, Lucas County, in said State and is authorized to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, and to conduct generally the business of buying, selling and otherwise disposing of coffee, teas, spices, etc., under and by its corporated name of The Woolson Spice Company.

The Plaintiff states that on \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1918 the defendant, Edgar Robinson, became indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of \$64.35 for goods, wares, <sup>merchandise</sup> sold and delivered to said ~~Robinson~~ <sup>defendant</sup> on said date and at the said ~~Robinson's~~ instant and request and which sum the said defendant agreed and promised to pay. An itemized statement of account for same is filed herewith and made a part of this petition, marked "Exhibit A" for the purpose of identification.

It states that on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1918 the said defendant executed and delivered to plaintiff his check on the Farmers Bank of Salvisa, <sup>by</sup> for the said sum, \$64.35 and purporting to be in payment of said debt.

It states that said check was presented at said bank in due course of business, but was returned to said plaintiff unpaid, the reason assigned therefor being that the said defendant did not have on deposit in said bank, a sum sufficient for the payment thereof; and that said debt is wholly unpaid. A true copy of said check is filed herewith and made a part thereof, marked "Exhibit B" for the purpose of identification.

Wherefore, the plaintiff prays a judgment against said defendant, Edgar Robinson, for the said sum of \$64.35 with interest there-
