Plaintiff, for cause of action herein alleges as

follows:

That it is a corporation organized under and exist-
ing by virtue of the laws of the State of Connecticut;
that as such it has the power to sue and be sued and to
contract and be contracted with; that it was so organized
and existing and so empowered at all times herein men-
tioned and now is.

That the defendant, J. S. Vaught, Jr. is indebted to
it in the sum of \$121.80 with interest at six per cent
from December 16th 1927 for goods, wares and merchandise
turnished, sold and delivered to said defendant at his
special instance and request and for which defendant prom-
ised and agreed to pay.

It says that payment has been demanded but that defend-
and has failed and refused to pay the said amount or any
part thereof and that the whole of same is now due and ow-
ing and unpaid.

Wherefore plaintiff prays judgment against defendant for
the sum of \$121.80 with interest at 6% from December 16th
1927 until paid; for its costs herein and all further re-
lief it may appear entitled both legal and equitable.
