The Plff, First National Bank states that it is a corporation duly organized under the laws of the United States, and doing business as a National Bank, with its principal place of business at Harrodsburg, Ky.

It states that the Defendant Edgar Robinson was on Feby 4th 1919 doing business with the Plff as a depositor, and that on said date he gave upon the Plaintiff a check which the Plaintiff paid, and by the payment of which the account of the said Robinson was over drawn to the amount of \$122.76, and that the said Robinson is indebted to the Plaintiff by reason of the payment of the said check as aforesaid in the said sum, no part of which has ever been paid. It says that the Deft was duly notified of said over draft and demand made upon him to repay the same and that he has refused and still refuses to pay said over draft.

It says that the said check so given was an order upon the Plaintiff to pay said sum and was duly signed and executed by the Defendant, and that no part thereof has ever been paid.

Wherefore it prays judgment against the Deft for the said sum of \$122.76 with interest from Feby 4th 1919, and for its cost and all proper relief.
