

no 1 If you believe from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that in this county
on the _____ day of August, 1918 the defendant, Mrs. James Brennon *committed murder of the 1st degree* cursed, abused
and threatened one Ham Clarke, you will find the defendant guilty as charged in
the warrant and fix her punishment at a fine of not less than one cent nor more
than \$100 ~~00~~ or at imprisonment at not less than ~~ten~~ ^{five} nor ~~more~~ more than fifty days,
or at both such fine and imprisonment, in your discretion.

If upon the whole evidence you have a reasonable doubt that the defendant has
been proven guilty it is your duty to acquit her.

no 3 By reasonable doubt as used in these instructions is meant a rational doubt
and one arising upon the evidence and for which a reason may be given, and not a
mere possibility that the defendant may not be guilty.
