The Plaintiff J T Ingram states that on Oct 3rd 1921 the defendant H F Ison by his promissory note which he executed abd delivered to the plaintiff, agreed and promised 90 days thereafter to pay to the plaintiff \$250. with interest thereon from date, no part of which has ever been paid except, on the 16th day of Dec 1921 he paid the sum of \$45. On the 31st day of March 1922 he paid the sum of \$60. and on the 17th day of Feby 1923 the sum of \$32.50, leaving a balance due on said note of \$127.20 with interest thereon from Feby 17th 1923. Said note is filed herewith

He says that that his claim is just and that he ought to recover of the defendant the amount claimed : that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution and that the ~~effort~~ collection of the plaintiff's demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found.

Wherefore the plaintiff prays judgment against the defendant for the said sum of \$127.20 with interest thereon from Feby 17th 1923, for a general order of attachment including garnishee, and for his cost and for all proper relief.
