1.... The Plaintiff says the defendant is indebted to him in the sum of \$30.50, /dated March 28, 1910, due Jany 1, 1911 agreed and promised to pay it said sum with interest from maturity, but that although long past due the note has never been paid. It says that it is a corporation organized under the laws of Kentucky.

Wherefore it prays for \$30.50 with 6% interest from Jany 1, 1910, and costs and all proper relief.

2.... Plaintiff further staes the defendant by his promisory note dated Dec. 21, 1909, due Jany 1, 1911 agreed and promised to pay it the sum of \$101.80 with interest from maturity until paid, and that there has been paid thereon the sum of \$60.00 paid on the day of 191, that it is a corporation, and both notes are filed as part hereof.

Wherefore it prays judgment for \$101.80 less \$60 credit and costs and all proper relief.
