Affiant, J.D. Disponett, states that he is the owner and ~~an~~ immediate entitled to the possession of two red hogs, weighing about 150 pounds each and worth the sum of \$30.00, now in the possession of Defendant, G. Alford. He says that said hogs were taken wrongfully from him by the Defendant on or about August 1, 1920, and wrongfully and illegally held by him from that date to the present, and he believes he ought to recover of Defendant both of said hogs and \$10.00 for the wrongful detention thereof. He says that said property was not taken for a tax or fine against the Plaintiff, or under any order or judgment against him; nor seized under an execution, distress warrant or attachment against his property. He says that his cause of action has accrued within one year just prior to this date. He states that his claim to said property is just, and he asks the court for an order for the immediate possession of said hogs and damages in the sum of \$10.00, and his cost herein expended. He prays for all proper relief.
