The plaintiff, A. B. Teater, states that the defendant, Homer Yates, is indebted to him in the sum of \$ 32.70 for goods wares and merchandise sold and deliver to this defendant at defendant's special instance and request and for which he agreed and promised to pay.

Plaintiff says that although often requested the defendant has failed and refused to pay all or any part of said debt and that he still ~~xx~~ fails and refused to pay all or any part of said debt and that ~~same is sum~~ of the whole of said debt is now due and owing, no part of which has been paid.

Plaintiff states that this is an action for the recovery of money due upon a contract and that the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiff's demand, and the collection of the demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.
