The plaintiff J.G.Teater states that the defendant John McDaniel is indebted to him in the sum of \$50,26, for account he was compelled to pay Fort Harrod Motor Company in the sum of \$11,61, for partnership dent of plaintiff and defendant and for the sum of ~~\$30,00~~, advanced to defendant in produce business and for the sum of \$8,65, for furniture sold to defendant and for which he promised and agreed to pay and which furniture was sold by I. Teater and which account is now owned by the plaintiff; he says that said amount is just due and unpaid and no part of same has been paid; he says that the defendant has no property in this State. Subject to execution or not enough thereof to satisfy the claim plaintiff and the demands of defendants creditors and that the collection of his claim will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment or a return of no property found.

Wherefore he prays judgment against the defendant for the sum of \$50,26, with interest and a general order of attachment against the property of the defendant, that Ed Phillips be summoned as a witness herein, for his costs and for whatever relief he may appear entitled to.
