Dean, states that the defendant, W.R.Currens, is indebted to him in the sum of \$65.00 for goods and merchandise furnished, sold and delivered to plaintiff at his special instance and request, in the year 1918. Said sum is just, due and unpaid though payment has been repeatedly demanded. He says the defendant has no property in this State subject to execution, or not enough thereof to satisfy the plaintiff's demands and the demands of the defendant's creditors, and the collection of the said demand will be endangered by delay in obtaining judgment and a return of no property found.

Wherefore, plaintiff prays for a judgment against the defendant in the sum of \$65.00, for all costs expended in this action and for all relief to which is or may appear to be entitled including a general attachment of the said defendant's property.
