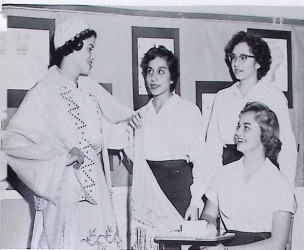

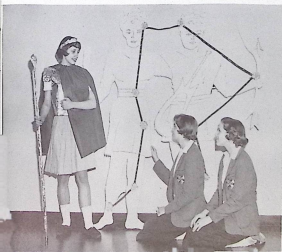

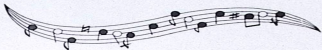

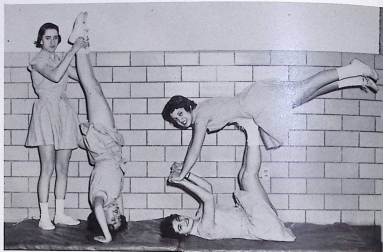


IT'S TIME FOR SPORTS!

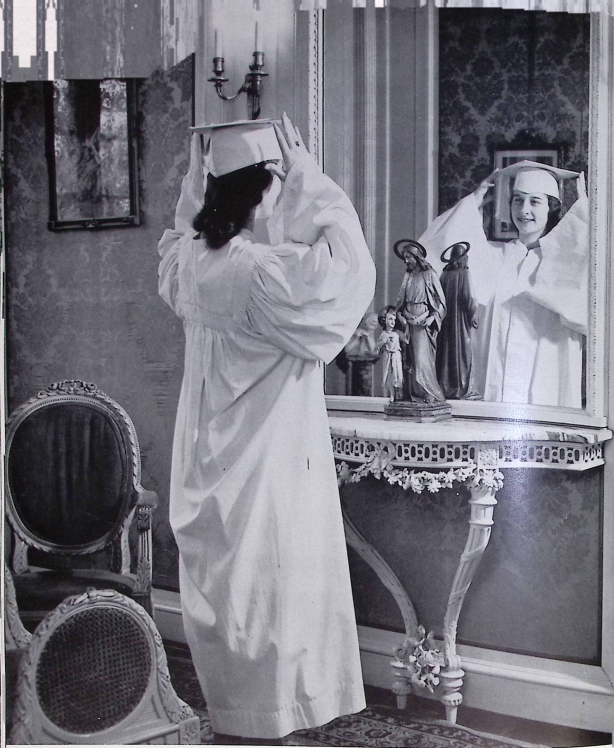

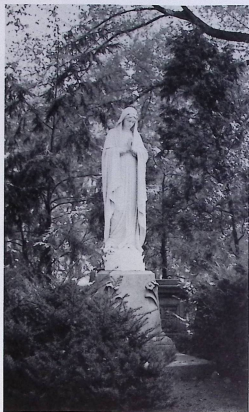
