Limited access to clean water, proliferation nuclear knowledge, unjust division of wealth in the world, no fair distribution of fossil energy, etc. are an enumerative summing up for a reason to begin a war. 'You ain't nothing seen yet', to use a phrase of poor Ronald Reagan.
