Order: Clupéiformes Family: Clupéomorphe



Armigatus brevissimus

Genus: Armigatus Grande, 1982

Age: Upper Cretaceous- 100 million years

Locality: Haqil- Byblos - Lebanon

Geographical distribution: Middle East

Features: Small oval-shaped fish with dorsal fin in the middle of the back. Characterized by scuts or dorsal bone patches on the two-thirds of the distance between the dorsal fin and the skull.

Remarks: First Lebanese species to be described by De Blainville in 1818, under the name of *Clupea brevissima*. It was called later on *Diplomystus brevissimus* and receive in the 80s its present day name *Armigatus brevissimus* (de Blainville, 1818)

Recent relatives: Genus close to present day sardines and herrings.
