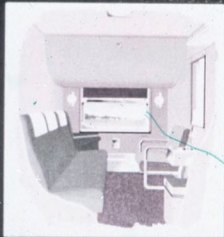

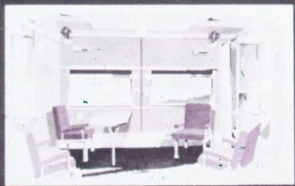

Next morning he repacks his suitcase.




