

Dear Jo Ann

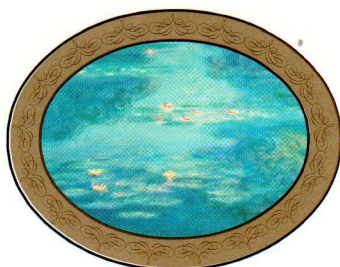
