at Tulalip Hospital. - Great, great, great niece Chief Seattle.
Moved to Burien in 1949-50

Father's name Charles Oliver not Tulalip -
Part Chinook + part Cowlips.

Uncle was superintendent of Indian Schools
at Tulalip + later for Washington. Last name
Johnson.

Father was a logger + fisherman

Both parents went to Indian ~~Board~~
Boarding Schools in Chinab (?)

Great Uncle is Victor Johnson - Lummi

Mother was Suquamish, ~~Du~~ Duwamish, Stillquamish,
Snohomish + German

Grandmother died during flu epidemic ~~at~~ in
1920's + is buried near ~~Chief~~ Chief Seattle.

Mother was very smart, spent whole life in
Indian Boarding Schools.

Mother's grandmother was Jane Garrison

Mother's family name - Henrys. Roy Henry + Ann
lived in Miller's Bay - Suquamish

In 40's or 50's Cecile was taken to U W Burke
~~Museum~~ Museum + had her picture taken in front of
a teepee. Was not proud - was embarrassed.

Suit ~~for~~ for lost lands of the Duwamish
people - went on for 60 years. Attorney's
received most of the \$\$, Each member
who could prove they were Duwamish - received
\$6400.

Mother was a crab shaker at a cannery on the
waterfront. Crab shaking is a way to clean the
crabs. Take off the four legs on each side &
then use steel hammer & crack. Then tap the
crab. Shake 2 or 3 hundred pounds a day -
very good living during the 40's & 50's.
