And keep pace it did! Over the past five years, the Scarab has carried the Meister Brauser colors to an all-time record of twenty-five victories. Drivers: Chuck Daigh, Augie Pabst, John Kilborn, Bill Wuesthoff, Carroll Shelby, Dick Rathmann, Harry Heuer, and Don Devine, have sat behind the wheel and guided the Chevrolet-powered fuel injected aluminum bodied speedster to victory over almost every track in the country. They, along with thousands of enthusiastic fans will never again feel the thrill of seeing the gleaming blue and white speedster in action, but they'll always remember the many exciting times it took the checkered flag to victory.
