September 1918	2	51	Letter	Saw Dr. Page Edmunds. Men more homesick. To Baby- death of Uof MD nurse, Miss Cox, from dysentery.
October 1918	2	52	Letter	To Marv and "everybody"- very busy, Dr. Edmunds will be leaving and will be married
October 1918	2	53	Letter	To Baby- very busy

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October 1918	2	54	Letter	To sister (need to make copy)
October 1918	2	55	Letter	To Baby- went to town with Miss Parsons
October 1918	2	56	Letter	To Marv- Describing how beautiful the day is in France
October 1918	2	57	Letter	Too faint to read
November 11, 1918	2	58	Letter	To Marv- "Finis la guerre" celebrations taking place

January 3, 1919	2	61	Letter	To Marv- Anticipating return home, date uncertain. "I will wear Christmas gift of silk stockings on return home!"
January 12, 1919	2	62	Letter	To sister and Elise- speaks of disappointment that the nurses in Base Hospital 12 will remain and doctors will return home. Spends time with Miss Parsons, who is "A scream," "so funny and inconsistent," she carries on with men, acts indifferent to them, but is "crazy" about them.
January 28, 1919	2	63	Letter	To Marv- On the way home, waiting for a train that is late, hopes to be home March 1.
February 2, 1919	2	64	Letter	To sister- train ride took 4 days. Now in La Baule, the "Atlantic City" of France, awaiting orders to board ship for home.
February 14, 1919	2	65	Letter	To Marv- still waiting for orders to board ship
February 15, 1919	2	66	Letter	To sister- still waiting to board ship, days are long, cannot leave the camp since orders could come at any time.
June 13, 1918	2	67	Certificate of Identity	Picture, finger print, 35 years, 130 lbs, blue eyes, brown hair
