# INTRODUCTION.

WISCONSIN DISTRICT RECORD.

"It shall be the duty of each School-District Clerk: (1) To report the name and post-office address of each officer of his district to the Town Clerk, or if a joint district, the Town Clerk of each town in which his district, or any part thereof, is situated, within ten days after the election or appointment of such officer. (2) To act as clerk when present, and record the proceedings of each district, and minutes of all meetings, orders, resolutions, and other proceedings of the District Board, in the Record Book provided by the Board, and to enter therein copies of all reports made by him to the Town Clerk. (3) To make in such book, or in some other suitable one, a record of all orders drawn upon the Treasurer. (4) To draw orders on the Treasurer for money in his hands, which has been appropriated to or raised by the district for that purpose, in payment, when due, of the wages of legally qualified teachers who have been employed by the Board, and have taught the school of such district, and also to draw orders on the Treasurer for money in his hands, to be disbursed for any other purpose, voted by a district meeting, according to the provisions of section four hundred and thirty, and each order shall designate the object for which and the fund upon which it is drawn, and shall be countersigned by the director. No order shall be drawn, countersigned, or paid, which is in favor of any person who has taught school in said district when not holding a certificate of qualification thereof, as provided by law, nor for the payment of which the money has not been appropriated according to law, and no order shall be drawn for any money received from the school fund income for any other purpose than payment of teachers' wages. (5) To furnish, at the expense of the district, for the use of each teacher, a school register in the form prescribed by the State Superintendent, to procure the same to be returned by him at the expiration of the teacher's employment, and to preserve the same with the records and papers of the district. (6) To perform such other duties as are or shall be imposed upon him by law."—Section 446, SCHOOL LAWS, 1880.

To aid the District Clerks in keeping their records according to the law above quoted, this book has been prepared. Its arrangement is simple, easily understood, and it is designed to produce uniformity in keeping the records of Districts, so that each successive Clerk shall know just what was done by his predecessor.

In Parts I and II, all the proceedings of District meetings, Annual and Special, are to be recorded, in a short and concise manner, by the District Clerk. The following formula for recording the proceedings of a School meeting is given, as a guide to the inexperienced:

JUNE 5th, 1882.

The legal voters of this District met at the School House, on this Monday evening, at 7 o'clock, according to notice previously given. ANDREW SMITH was chosen Chairman of the meeting, and WILLIAM GROESBECK Clerk, pro tem. ED. S. HAYDEN, was unanimously elected District Clerk for the term of three years from this date. It was voted to raise the sum of One Hundred and Fifty dollars by special tax, for repairs on the School House and premises. It was further voted that the sum of Seventy-Five dollars be added to the above amount for the purchase of fuel and other necessary appendages for the convenience of the winter school. On motion, it was voted to raise the sum of Forty dollars, by tax on the District, for the purchase of Outline Maps and other School Apparatus for the use of the school in this District. It was also voted that the school shall be taught Four months during the ensuing winter, and Five months during the coming summer, and within the present school year. On motion, it was voted to authorize the District Board to admit non-resident pupils into the school during the present year, as they shall deem proper. On motion, the meeting adjourned, without date.

In Part III, all the transactions of the School Directors are to be fully and carefully recorded.

The duties of the District Board are so clearly defined in section 431 to 441 School Law of 1880, that they need not be repeated here.

The following formula may aid the inexperienced in recording the proceedings of the Directors:

OCTOBER 9th, 1882.

The School Board for this District met this day, at the house of the District Clerk, at 7 o'clock P. M., according to previous notice. The Director, *John Brown*, was appointed Chairman of the meeting. On motion, the "Rules and Regulations," as printed in Part 7, in this District Record, were unanimously adopted as Rules for the government of the schools in this District. On motion, it was agreed to employ a male teacher for the ensuing winter term of school, and that seventy-five per cent. of the common school fund belonging to this District be applied to the support of the winter school. On motion, it was voted to allow *Sarah Smith, John Hinton, and William Mosher*, to attend the school during the winter term, for the sum of six dollars per term for their tuition, payable to the District Treasurer, in advance. On motion, the meeting adjourned, without date.

The above may be followed in recording any ordinary business performed by the Board. The words printed in italics, in actual proceedings, are to be changed to suit circumstances.

The other parts of the book are so plain, and their design is so apparent, that no remarks upon the manner of keeping them is necessary.

This Record has been prepared expressly to systematize, lighten, and simplify the work of recording the proceedings of the district. It is earnestly hoped that the forms here given will be faithfully and strictly adhered to by all School Officers, as it is believed that by so doing, order, regularity, fullness, accuracy, and permanency in our Educational Records and Statistics will be had. Correct Records of our Schools are of vital importance to our educational interests. They may be taken as evidence in courts of law, and not unfrequently are of the utmost importance to our Schools on this account.

Besides, correct Records are the only means of obtaining and procuring reliable statistics of the School, and supplying to the State and tax payers the evidence they have a right to demand, of the operations of our important free school system.
