

Motion made and seconded to enlarge the Dist. Offices as follows. Clerk \$10.00, Director and Treasurer \$5.00 each. The motion prevailed.

Moved and seconded to adjourn. The motion was carried. J. A. Smith, Chairman. Geo. Larson, Director. C. S. Smith, Clerk. O. M. Olson, Treasurer.



The following is a CORRECT PLAT drawn and numbered in accordance with the foregoing descriptions of boundaries.




The square bounded by the heavy lines represents the original Township; the squares on the outside represent Sections in adjoining Townships.




