

# Escaped Bull Throws All Wesleyville in Wild Panic

WESLEYVILLE residents were thrown into panic Wednesday afternoon, when a 1,000-pound bull pulled the ring out of his nose and broke from his captors in front of the Joseph Himmel meat market, 3446 Buffalo rd.

The bull, which had been purchased earlier in the afternoon by Mr. Himmel from the Mack farm, R. F. D. No. 1, Wesleyville, was being unloaded from a truck in in front of the meat emporium, when he staged his escape.

A passing street car attracted the attention of the bull and he charged after it, frightening the conductor and passengers. In fact, it was the only street car ever seen to leave Wesleyville at such a high

rate of speed.

The maddened animal then turned his attention to a passing automobile. The driver, forgetting all speed regulations of the boro, county and state, made a quick get-away.

Crowds of children and men followed the bull, carrying all manner of clubs, knives and rocks. The animal finally turned north and started through a field toward the lake.

At this juncture, O. B. Kelley, Wesleyville grocer and a 'crack' shot, arrived on the scene. In a few moments the cause of the panic was at rest, and peace was restored in the boro.
