

# The C.I.A. and the Greek Coup

Papandreou Reveals U.S. A Startling charge of Amer-Role In Overthrow and Control of Greece

ican C.I.A. control of the Greek Intelligence Service that masterminded the military coup that overthrew parliamentary government in Greece in 1967 has been made

by Andreas Papandreou, former Greek Minister of State.

Mr. Papandreou, son of the former Prime Minister of Greece, George Papandreou, and now leader of the Panhellenic Liberation Movement, told me that the Greek Intelligence Service was one of the government agencies under his jurisdiction as Minister of State, and that when he assumed that office, he sought to acquaint himself with its structure, staff, operations and budget, as he did with other agencies and departments under his authority.

however. Instead he was told that it was none of his business nor that of any other part of the Greek Government. He says that he was informed bluntly that it was an appen dage of the American Central Intelligence Agency and not under the control of the Greek government. It was financed entirely and directly by the American C.I.A. and not by the Greek government, according to Papandreou.

"I protested this, " Papandreou exclaimed to me, "for I think that every government should have its own intelligence service, independently of whether it is an ally or not of another country
