Mr. George J. Good.

For the remodeling of your new store to be located at 2288 Telegraph Avenue, Berkeley, California, I submit specifications and bid as follows:

The entire store front will be removed and a new front will be installed with the entrance set back about eight feet (8') into the store. For size and shape of windows see floor plan.

The height of the base of the show windows will be about two feet and six inches (2'- 6") with a plank floor effect inside the windows.

The ceiling of the vestibule and show windows will have a beam effect. These beams, as well as the balance of the woodwork of the store front, will be given a heavy and rustic effect. The floor of the vestibule will be of tile in red shades and varying in size making the pattern with sizes laid at random.

Inside the store we will install a platform about three feet (3') high, twelve feet (12') deep and the width of the room. This platform will have the stairs on the south side with bannister as shown in plans.

FIXTURES.

There will be two cases in the front part of the sales department of the store for furnishing goods. The cases will be about six feet (6') high, eight feet (8') long and two feet and eight inches (2'- 8") deep. There will be two drawers in each case and shelving above and below.

I will supply one case which will have the effect of an old chest on the face side and the back will be used as a wrapping counter; this counter will be about seven feet (7') long, one foot and eight inches (1'- 8") wide and four feet (4') high.
