Scope and Content

The collection consists of administrative records and collected ephemera from the Vassar-Warner Home and their preceding institutions. Material includes annual reports, board

reports directories, residence lists, cemetery records, and some administrative correspondence. There are also some relevant newspaper clippings, ephemera, and photographic prints in the collection.

Historical Note

In 1871, the goal of Alice Warner came true. Roland Warner (or Jonathan R. Warner?) bought the old Dutchess Academy building that had been displaced with the establishment of the modern high school system in the 1840s. There he endowed the Warner Home for elderly women. Soon after, the Vassar brothers, Matthew (the younger) and John Guy donated their home on the corner of Main Street and Vassar Street and funded a three story brick building at that location. The new building opened in 1881 as the Vassar home for elderly men. The Vassar Home continued its mission on Main and Vassar continuously before moving to Church Street in 1974. In 1975 the two institutions merged, becoming the Vassar-Warner Home. In 1986 the two divisions moved into the same building – the newly renovated South Hamilton Street Residence. Charles A. Butts was treasurer of the Warner Home during the early 1960s.
