The Great Nine Partners Patent was granted to John Aarston (or Jan Aarston), William Creed, James Emott (or James Emmot), Hendrick ten Eyck, Lt. Colonel Henry Filkin, Major Augustin

Graham, Colonel Caleb Heathcote, David Johnstone, and Jarvis Marshall in 1697 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England.
