

Pemberton April 6th 1844

Dear Uncle

I write to say that I have received your check on the bank for ninety dollars. wich I payed away to day.

Our drover has made an asingment to a good man. but I have been doubting in my own mind if I will come in under the assignment because I think he will pay but a small sum and so much depends upon the hoesty of the fellow as I suppose that he has no book account.

We have had some expectations of seeing you up her this last week as the weather has been so fine and pleasant.

Please tell Andrew that we would like to have that church book and soon as he thinks it expediant.

Your plaster is ready to put on the land and it shall be put on next week.

The bones that I purchased have arrived if Mr Croft should apply to you for pay you would oblige me by paying it. there was eighty bushels at thirty cents and 20 at fourty cents.
