



TO THE FINDERS OF BIG  
HUCKLEBERRIES.

Summer of 1913.

1. Fill a bottle FULL of the largest berries on each bush even if some of them do drop through the gauge. The price for the bush will be according to the size of the largest berry in the bottle.
2. Fasten all four labels that are in the bottle on the bush.
3. Fill the bottle up from the Formalin bottle as soon as you get home.
4. As soon as possible bring or send the bottle of berries to me.

Your gauge is just the size of the dollar spot, I do not want any bush that has not at least one berry that will not drop through it.

The prices of the larger berries will be fixed when they are measured with the large gauge by myself. The berries grow a little smaller after they have been in the Formalin a few days and if you do not get them measured quickly the \$3 berry may shrink to the \$2 size or the \$1.50 berry to the \$1.

The money will be paid when the bushes are dug and any time spent in taking me to the bush and helping dig it will be paid for in addition to the price of the bush.

No bush will be paid for unless I or my representative is present when it is dug.

Each bush will be kept entirely separate from all others and if you come to Whitesbog any time during the next five years I expect to be able to tell exactly who found each bush planted there and show the number of small plants raised from it.
