

Lisbon Farm Oct 29th 1844

Dear Uncle

I have been up to George Town the cattle market. and made a small purchase of cattle. and should like to have it in my power to purchase some more this week and can onley do it through your kindness in loaning me the money to do it with. cattle are considerable higher than they were this time last year and I have a large amount of stalcks to destroy. One hundred and seventy dollars would get all that would be necessary this fall. and I would be much oblige to you if you would send me that amount by mail.

My corn crop is very good this fall having aviraged one hundred an two bushels of ears to the acre on the old timothy meadow and awfull corn besides. my whole crop is about one thousand bushels of shelled corn. We have very whet times now and my buckwheat has been cut several weeks and I have not been able to thresh it.

My seven steers a lost never to be found again I fear.
