


Tundra Swans at Whitesbog



Send in the swans. Don't bother, they're here. Yes, the tundra swans have returned to Whitesbog from northern Canada. You can find them by driving over the sandy roads around the bogs, or you can join a group and learn all about them from the experts.

Guided tours to see the winter home of the tundra swans will be conducted on February 8 and 15 at 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM. There will be Moonlight Walks around Whitesbog Village at 7:00 PM January 18, February 15, March 15 and April 19.

All of these events will start at the General Store. Participants are asked to contribute \$5 to benefit the Whitesbog Preservation Trust.

Volunteer work days are scheduled from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM on February 1, March 1 and April 5. These events are free.

The Whitesbog Preservation Trust was formed in 1982 by a group of concerned people who wanted to save this historic village. The Trust has rehabilitated homes, workers' cottages, the General Store, barrel factory and Suningive, the home of Elizabeth White, developer of cultivated blueberries.
