

DESCRIPTION OF HOLLY VARIETIES OFFERED BY HOLLY HAVEN INC.

FEMALE or Berry Bearing Holly Trees

All of these have been critically selected because of their rich dark green foliage which does not burn readily with winter winds and which regularly produce abundant crops of attractive, red berries. All have the typical spiny holly leaf. All originate in New Jersey at about the latitude of Philadelphia or in New England and have been exposed to winter temperatures much below zero.

Spring frost, which may occur after new holly growth has started, may destroy a season's crop of berries without permanently injuring the tree itself.

75¢	70¢	1. <u>GRISCOM</u> - is a famous variety. The parent tree, located near Woodbury N.J. was carefully measured in 1942 and was found to be 54 feet high, the trunk 5 ft. 3 in. in circumference with a spread of 26 ft. A remarkable tree.
75¢	70¢	2. <u>St. MARY</u> - originated in New England and has withstood severe weather conditions. The leaves are rather small with a graceful twist. The smallest plants are unusually upright in habit. A rarely beautiful tree.
70¢	65¢	3. <u>SALLY</u> is from New England and was selected by the late Dr. Britton, Director of the New York Botanical Garden. It bears abundant crops regularly and its berries have an unusual high gloss as if they were varnished.
65¢	60¢	4. <u>PARAGE</u> - is very symmetrical and vigorous. Foliage is dark green and dense. It is a consistent bearer of heavy crops of berries, some of which remain on the tree to the following summer. A most satisfactory variety.
65¢	60¢	5. <u>MAE</u> - is a slender tree, like a pointed fir. It is very lovely and has a place in any planting scheme. Also a heavy bearer.
65¢	60¢	6. <u>MANIG</u> - is a fast grower and a surprisingly heavy bearer. When well established, a young tree, under ideal conditions, has grown as much as 4 ft. in a single season.

60¢	55¢	7. <u>CLARK</u> - is a bushy small tree, easily kept in shape for semi-formal hedges from three to six feet high. It will grow considerably higher if allowed. A consistent producer of berries.
60¢	55¢	8. <u>HOPKINS</u> - is a good reliable bearer of bright red berries.
60¢	55¢	9. <u>SARAH HIGGINS</u> - is a vigorous tree with large leaves and heavily laden with berries.

MALE HOLLIES (no berries)

Male hollies produce the pollen which is carried by the bees to the flowers on the female tree.

One male tree will serve several (approximately ten) berry bearing tree, provided that the male and female tree bloom at the same time. Some male trees bloom too early or too late to give pollen when the average female tree is ready for it.

Male trees are apt to grow faster than female trees.

A good male holly tree is a thing of wondrous beauty even though it does not carry the beloved red berries. In some landscape work, especially in a location where the holly trees are exposed to vandalism the absence of berries may be a real advantage.

The males listed here have been chosen for the same fine foliage characteristics as the selected females.

| A. | <u>ISAIAH</u>       | - is one of the older male varieties and makes an excellent landscape specimen.   |
