

Lisbon Farm April 25th 42

Dear Uncle

I received your letter on Thursday night last inclosing a draft for fifty dollars on the Camden Bank.

I noted also your remarks about the Saltars and will say that Uncle and Aunt intend to leave here in a short time and Anne will go with them I expect. I was well aware in what light you looked upon L. Farm and that you expected me do all in my power to make it a place where your family could retreat with pleasure in the hot summer months. it will always give me pleasure to do so. but a word for myself. that is when we have an enormous family in harvest time it can be nether present for the visitors nor the visited. but if they can not take any other time let them come then. the last week of June and two or three weeks of July is our harvest month in this part of the country. Mr. Toby arrived in town to day I suppose. informed you of his familie's safe arrival at H. In the letter before last you said that clover seed was very cheep, next spring I wish to sow about six bushels and if you think it will keep well please purchase that amount for me
