

New Lisbon March 26th 1843

Dear Uncle

I am under the necessaty of sending to you for ninety dollars. that is not what I expected do but the drover that I sold my cattle to. was robed on his way from New York in the railroad car. and it is the general opinion that we farmers that sold him our cattle will not get our money. and that is what I expected to have to pay my debts to the machanics &c who expect there pay at this time.

I take this opertunity to say that I have planted out those pair trees in the old field back of where the house is to stand.

Rhichard wished me to say that he received no letter to night. and that he has been drawing hevily this week.

Mary & I unite in sending our invitation to any of the family who wish to spend the summer at our house as usual. We are all well
