Dear Andrew,

I came out to this place. to the Dr funeral who died in few days sickness. of softning of the brain and paralysis of the lower bowells. On sunny yesterday in butafull grounds. surrounded by beautiful views of hills woods. and village views. we placed the body in the ground. a large congrigation in the church. The family rēceiving many kindness from the people.

Margaretta is still undecided what to do with herself. she hopes to receive about 1500 Dollars from the Clergamin insurance league that she hopes will pay all her **debts**.

She wished me to offer her servises to Mr Reilly to be matron of a girls school. that he is about to build at Haddonfield. and several other things. But Walter Barrett offers to board with her if she will rent a house at Clearfield. and says he will bring Alonzo up as a lawyer. and help her as much as is in his power and this looks more tangabel than anything offered to Margaret. that is if she can get a few more boarders. She desires me to write this letter to you. and I shall stay here untill ~~she~~ she desides what she will do with herself if possible. She dea res me to send to you and cousin Caroline her best love
