


The cranberry harvest begins anew





It's fall, and with the change of seasons brings cooler weather, leaves falling, football games... and cranberries. Seen here out and about town are scenes from one cranberry harvest.

According to the Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Burlington County, "Wild cranberries have long been harvested in the New Jersey Pine Barrens since the early settlers came to this country. Benjamin Thomas of Pemberton was one of the first individuals to actually cultivate cranberries in the area around 1835. Other important people in the formation of the cranberry industry in New Jersey included J. J. White of Whitesbog, and Theodore Budd of Pemberton. Theodore Budd was responsible for the initial meeting of a the American Cranberry Growers in 1869 which remains a viable association to this day."
