INTRODUCTION

The following list of immigrants from the village of Eckartsweier in Baden, Germany, was compiled at the request of the undersigned by the honorable ALFRED HETZEL and his wife, PAULINE (LUTZ) HETZEL during the Christmas holidays of 1979. At the time ALFRED HETZEL was Mayor (Ortsvorsteher) of Eckartsweier.

The information on the following pages was taken from the church books of the village church, the Evangelical Church of St. Nicholas. The first church was built in the village in 1395. The present church was built in 1823 and was rebuilt after World War II in 1953. An Evangelical ministry has served the community since 1635.

The information on the following pages is essentially as I have received it from Eckartsweier. I have omitted the cross references to the pages in the church books and have added one name to the list.

In preparing the list for publication I have tried faithfully to copy the spellings of the original, distinguishing especially between WALTHER and WALTER, ANNA MARIA and ANNA MARIE, ELISABETH and ELISABETHA.

The places for all births, marriages and deaths is Eckartsweier unless otherwise noted.

Two special notes must be made. Sometimes the occupation for the head of a family is given. The original here distinguishes between "Bauer" and "Landwirt". Both are farmers. A "Landwirt" is more prosperous and exercised more control over his land. In the following I have translated the first, "Farmer" and the second, "Land owner." It might have been better to translate the first, "Farm laborer" and the second, "Farmer".

The other thing to be noted is the very small number of Christian names in use in the village. Consequently, the various heads of families were also given a number. Thus, for example, on p. 7, MICHAEL LUTZ 15 is listed. He is the son of ANDREAS LUTZ 2 (p. 6). Thus, the 15 is simply an identifying mark. In 1850 the population of Eckartsweier was about 560. Of that number at least 16 were named MICHAEL LUTZ!

Many of the people listed here settled in Portage County, Wisconsin, and a goodly number of them in and around the village of Almond where I was born and raised. My grandfather, ANDREW LUTZ, was born in Eckartsweier in 1881 (p. 10).

I have used and am presently using this list with a great deal of enjoyment. I herewith present it in printed form so that others may also use it in their genealogical research.

The 1900 census for Almond township lists John Walter, 56, b. Oct. 1843 in Baden, Em. 1848, Farmer. Mary, his wife, 53, b. Jan. 1847 in Ger. Em. 1847, m. 32 years. 6 children, 4 living. Children listed are: FRED G., 24, b. Apr 1876, and OSCAR F. 12, b. Feb 1888.

Almond Press, 28 Nov 1924: Death of John Walters, Sr. b. 23 Oct 1843, Eckartsweier; m. Mary Beck in 1867; was Civil War Vet. (Co. B, 46th Regiment of Wis. promoted to Cpl. 2 Mar 1865); joined Methodist Church under Rev. J. Beinert in 1882; survived by 4 sons: Albert and Oscar of California; John and Fred of Almond.

Dad L. says that Johann G. Walther and Andrew Walther (p.4) were brothers. Question: Was David Walther (p.3) also a brother?

MICHAEL LUTZ 16 was a tavern keeper for a time in Stevens Point, Wi. Later he moved to Duluth, MN, where he died in 1902. He was a cousin of ANDREW LUTZ (the brewer). The son, MICHAEL, was married to LOUISE KLINE of Wis. Rapids in 1888. She died young and is buried in Wis. Rapids. A surviving child of the marriage was raised by the daughter, BARBARA and husband.

BARBARA (the daughter) was married to FRANK HIBBING (for whom Hibbing, MN. is named!) He was born 14 Dec 1856 at Kirchboitzen, Hanover and died at age 40 in Duluth on 30 July 1897. FRANK and BARBARA were married on 14 May 1885, probably in Stevens Point. The daughter they raised, ANNA MARIE, later married Dr. Herrmann KOLLER of Minneapolis, MN.

REVEREND JOHN BEINERT

John Beinert was born on December 20, 1848 in Eckartsweier, Baden, Germany, and quietly passed away, after a long illness, on January 5, 1920, in St. Cloud, Florida, at the age of 71 years and 15 days. His life was marked by rich blessing and success and his death was with blessed peace and triumphant faith in Jesus Christ. The youngest son of pious and middle-class parents, he was instructed and brought up in the teachings of the German Evangelical State Church (Landeskirche). On the occasion of his Confirmation, the Spirit of God worked so powerfully in his heart, as he later testified, that he was without doubt at that time a child of God. His religious convictions were deeply influenced by his dear mother, who on her sickbed, laid hands on him and prayed to God in his behalf.

In June, 1870, he came to New York and then moved to Scranton, Pennsylvania. Here house devotions, prayer meetings and especially the prayers of certain individuals made a deep impression on him. He was thoroughly awakened (gründlich erweckt) and on December 4, 1871 was converted during a worship service. Rev. W. Kurth and his wife took a special interest in the young man and in the next year placed him in a school at Petersburg, near Scranton. Soon he was given responsibility as a Sunday School Superintendent, but when the District Superintendent, Rev. Seibel, urged him to become a minister, he was so fearful of this office that, like Jonah of old, he ran away. He went to visit relatives in Stevens Point and friends in Almond, Wisconsin.

It was here that Brother Beinert received the call of God and of the church to the holy ministry. Rev. G. Limper licensed him to speak in the public service (Ermahner); Rev. W. Wilke authorized him to serve as lay preacher in the local congregation (Lokalprediger) and Rev. R. Fickenschier, the District Superintendent, authorized him to serve as a lay minister (Prediger) in 1878. A year later he joined the Chicago German Conference and was ordained Deacon (Diakon) by Bishop Andrews and Elder (Aeltesten) by Bishop Merrill. During the next 33 years he served charges within the Conference at Kewaunee, Main, Almond, Fond du Lac, Wausau, Ripon, Sun Prairie, Milwaukee (5 congregations), Melvin, Ill. and Hammond, Ind. In each location he served with visible blessing and success. In various locations during his ministry there he was instrumental in erecting new church buildings, and he positively influenced a number of young men to become ministers. His wife was a true helper and shared in all the joys and sorrows of his work.

John Beinert and Elisabeth Walter were married at Scranton, Pennsylvania in 1871. Their marriage was blessed with seven children, 3 sons and 4 daughters. One of the sons died in childhood. Two of the daughters are married to ministers of the Chicago Conference. They are Rev. J. L. Menzner of Appleton, WI, and Rev. F. Koehnemann of South Bend, Ind.

Brother Beinert enjoyed the trust, as well as the respect and love of his superiors and colleagues and was always highly respected by the people he served.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his widow, Elisabeth Beinert nee Walter, the children all of whom are married: Ella, Rosa, Charles, Walter, Lydia, Laura. He is also survived by 2 daughters-in-law, 4 sons-in-law, 11 grandchildren, 1 great grand child, 3 sisters, 1 brother, together with other relatives and many friends, the sorrow of whom the Lord will bless as he prepares a happy reunion for them in the heavenly mansions.

WILHELMINE KROHN NEE KEMPFERT, WAS BORN AUGUST 21, 1827 IN DOHRINGHAGEN COUNTY NAUGART, GERMANY. SHE WAS MARRIED TO FRIEDRICH KROHN IN 1849. EIGHT SONS AND THREE DAUGHTERS WERE BORN TO THIS UNION. OF THESE SIX SONS AND TWO DAUGHTERS TOGETHER WITH HER HUSBAND PRECEED HER IN DEATH. IN 1856 SHE CAME WITH HER FAMILY TO AMERICA AND LIVED FOR A SHORT TIME IN MILWAUKEE. FROM THERE SHE MOVED TO POLK WHERE SHE LIVED FOR FOUR YEARS. FROM THERE SHE MOVED TO TOWN BERLIN, MARATHON COUNTY, THEN TO ALMOND, THEN TO STEVENS POINT, AND THEN ONCE MORE TO ALMOND. HERE SHE MADE HER HOME UNTIL HER DEATH WHICH CAME UNEXPECTEDLY THOUGH IT DID NOT FIND HER UNPREPARED. SHE WAS PLANNING TO GO TO APPLETON ON OCTOBER 13 TO VISIT HER DAUGHTER AND TO SPEND THE WINTER, AS SHE HAS FOR THE PAST THREE YEARS, BUT SHE DIED JUST ONE DAY BEFORE THE PLANNED JOURNEY OF HEART FAILURE. SISTER KROHN WAS CONVERTED TO GOD IN 1876 AND JOINED THE GERMAN METHODIST CHURCH UNDER THE MINISTRY OF REVEREND WILHELM WILKE. SHE WAS A FAITHFUL CHRISTIAN WHO LOVED HER SAVIOR ABOVE ALL ELSE, THEN THE BIBLE, THE CHURCH OF HER CHOICE, AND THEN THE "APOLOGISTS" -- THIS WAS HER CONFESSION. HER PLACE IN CHURCH WAS EMPTY ONLY WHEN BODILY INFIRMITY AND THE WEAKNESS OF AGE PREVENTED HER ATTENDANCE. SHE WAS NOT ONLY THE OLDEST MEMBER OF THE CONGREGATION HERE BUT ALSO OF ITS LADIES SOCIETY AND WAS FAITHFUL TO HER OBLIGATIONS SO THAT SHE WAS ABLE AS A GOOD STEWARD TO MEET HER MASTER. SHE LEAVES BEHIND TWO SONS, ALBERT KROHN, IN WHOSE HOME SHE RECEIVED HER FINAL CARE AND WHERE SHE DIED ON OCTOBER 12, 1915; CHARLES KROHN, A MEMBER OF THE CHICAGO GERMAN CONFERENCE AND A METHODIST MINISTER AT MARINETTE, WISCONSIN; ONE DAUGHTER, MATHILDA, THE WIFE OF REV. HENRY KARNOPP, SUPERINTENDENT OF THE APPLETON DISTRICT, TWO LIVING SISTERS, 25 GRANDCHILDREN, 20 GREAT GRAND CHILDREN, AS WELL AS OTHER RELATIVES AND MANY FRIENDS. SHE HAD SELECTED PHILIPPIANS 1.21 AS HER FUNERAL TEXT. BROTHERS J. L. MENZER OF WAUSAU AND ANTON HELD OF STEVENS POINT TOOK PART IN THE FUNERAL SERVICE.
