Dear Stevens Point City Band Member:

As the new music director and conductor of the Stevens Point City Band, it is my pleasure to invite you to join us again this year for our summer concert season.

As you may or may not know, Don Greene decided to retire from directing the City Band following our 2002 summer season. I hope that when you see Don, you will join me in expressing our thanks to him for all he has done over the past 15 years to build the band into a wonderful musical organization.

I'm truly excited about our upcoming season, and I look forward to seeing you all again! We will continue our schedule of Tuesday evening rehearsals and Wednesday evening concerts at Pfiffner Pioneer Park Bandshell. We will again perform on Memorial Day, Monday, May 26. However, we will start our regular season one week later -- with the first week of rehearsals being Tuesday and Wednesday, June 3 and 4. We will perform our usual nine weeks of concerts, with the final concert scheduled for Wednesday, August 6. With school systems now running later into June, it is our hope that this slightly later start date will enable even better participation and audience attendance.

#### **AUDITIONS**

We will continue with our standard audition policy of having woodwinds and brass/percussion re-audition every other year. All new members (regardless of instrument) are required to audition when they join. If it is not your required year to re-audition, you are still welcome to re-audition (if you choose) prior to the start of the season -- especially if you've really made lots of musical progress during the past year! ©

This year, ALL WOODWINDS will need to re-audition. All NEW personnel (regardless of instrument) are required to audition this year. Brass and percussion personnel can stand on your audition from last year, or you are welcome to re-audition this year if you'd like to try to move up in your section.

Auditions will be short and painless! © You will be given a copy of music which you can take to a practice room for 15 minutes. You then return to tape your audition (with no one present, if you wish).

Tentative seating arrangements, based on auditions, will be mailed prior to Memorial Day.

#### **GENERAL BAND POLICIES**

- 1. A set instrumentation will be used to determine the nucleus of the band.
- 2. The nucleus and seating will be determined by auditions.
- 3. All qualified players will be welcomed and urged to participate on a regular basis. However, only those selected as part of the nucleus of the band will be "on contract" to be paid. \*\* Please note: If you are listed as an "alternate", you are still a regular member of the band, and we look forward to your participation at all rehearsals and concerts.
- 4. If a "contracted" player is absent, the player next in line will be paid for that service. For example, if the nucleus of the cornet/trumpet section was six players, and one of those six players was excused, player number seven would move up and be paid for those services.
- 5. If a "contracted" player is absent an excessive amount of time, that player would be moved down and the player next in line would move to the nucleus roster.
- 6. The board of directors anticipates enough funds to pay all contracted players \$6.50 per hour (two hour rehearsal and one hour concert).

#### REHEARSAL SCHEDULE

Rehearsals will be held from 7:00 to 9:00 PM, every Tuesday, June 3 through July 29, and Wednesday, June 4. (Note: The first two rehearsals will run until 9:30 PM so that all preliminary business can be conducted.)

\*\* Due to the upcoming UWSP Music Department demolition and remodeling, our rehearsal site is a bit "up in the air" at this time. It is possible that we may be able to still utilize Room C-100 in the UWSP Fine Arts Center for rehearsals. If C-100 is unavailable, we will rehearse in the band room at Pacelli High School.

UWSP will know more about their summer schedule in upcoming weeks, therefore <u>I will let you know</u> exactly <u>where we</u> will rehearse when I mail out the tentative seating arrangement prior to Memorial Day.

#### STEVENS POINT CITY BAND POLICIES

The following guidelines are intended to ensure a good experience for everyone concerned.

- 1. A set instrumentation forms the nucleus of the band.
- 2. The nucleus and seating are determined by auditions.
- 3. All qualified players are welcome to participate. However, only those selected as part of the nucleus of the band will be "on contract" to be paid. \* Please note: If you are listed as an "alternate", you are still a regular member of the band, and we look forward to your participation at all rehearsals and concerts.
- 4. If a "contracted" player is absent, the player next in line will be paid for that service. For example: if the nucleus of the clarinet section was ten players, and one of those ten players was excused from a particular rehearsal and concert, player number eleven (1st alternate) would move up and be paid for those services.
- 5. If a "contracted" player is absent an excessive amount of time, that player would be moved down and the player next in line would move to the nucleus roster.
- 6. The board of directors anticipates enough funds to pay all contracted players \$6.50 per hour (two-hour rehearsals and one-hour concerts).
- 7. In order to receive a stipend, a player must attend a minimum of 80% of rehearsals and concerts. Exceptions may be made with prior approval of the director.
- 8. Notification of absence must be given to the director in writing at least one week prior to the planned absence so that substitutions can be made. Rehearsals preceding the concert are mandatory to perform in that concert unless permission is granted by the director. In the case of an emergency absence, call the director at 345-0061 (Kathy Kawleski).
- 9. Music may be taken home for practice, but you are responsible for having your music present at each rehearsal and concert, even when you are unable to attend. Players will be charged for all missing music.
- 10. DO NOT PARK on the street east of the band shell.

11. Required Concert Attire:

Women:

DARK skirt or slacks. WHITE top. Dark shoes.

Men:

DARK slacks. WHITE shirt. Dark shoes.

(No T-shirts, shorts or blue jeans are permitted.)

Players not dressed appropriately will not be paid for that performance.

- 12. Our concerts may be taped for later broadcast on public access TV (channel 3). Please close instrument cases and store them out of the way so that they are not conspicuous to the audience.
- 13. In case of rain or other inclement weather, concerts will be held indoors at the CenterPoint MarketPlace. In that event, it will be necessary for everyone to bring a music stand. Chairs will be provided, but all other equipment will have to be moved to the Mall.

#### **REHEARSAL SCHEDULE:**

Rehearsals will be held from 7:00 to 9:00 PM, every Tuesday, June 3 through July 29, and Wednesday, June 4, in Room C-100 of the UW-Stevens Point Fine Arts Center.

#### **CONCERT SCHEDULE:**

Every Wednesday, June 11 through August 6, 7:30-8:30 PM, Pfiffner Pioneer Park Band Shell, AND Tuesday, August 5, 7:00-8:00 PM, at the Portage County Health Care Center.
