### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES**

#### APRIL 15, 2003

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P.M. at the Crandell residence, 1916 Clark St. Stevens Point, Wisconsin.

She will be handling printing and mailing of musician letters and other word processing in cooperation with the Music Director, with goal of reducing unnecessary paperwork. She also agreed to serve as the Public Information Officer (PIO).

#### IV. OLD BUSINESS - 2003 Season Plans

- A. Alternate rehearsal space was discussed in case the UWSP Fine Arts Center construction project begins. Room C100 is slated for demolition. Kawleski reported that the Music Dept. would allow us to use Michelsen Hall except during music camp weeks. The consensus was that it would be better to use the same facility throughout the entire season. Public school facilities were given low priority due to their limited summer hours, elaborate security systems and probable maintenance staff costs. Kawleski had contacted Pacelli H.S., was awaiting confirmation and would look at the room the following week. Pacelli would charge \$25 per rehearsal. It was suggested we offer them \$200 for the entire summer. Ilten said he would contact St. Paul's Lutheran School as a back up.
